After Hugh Beaver decided to write *Guinness Book of World Records*, he was told that the twins Norris and Ross McWhirter were running a fact-finding company in London. Hugh Beaver invited the brothers to join him. They spent 3 years collecting the world records and in August 1954, *Guinnes Book of Records* was published( 出版). One thousand copies were printed and given away. Quickly, it went to the top of the British bestseller list. "It was a marketing giveaway — it wasn't supposed to be a money maker," said Beaver. The next year it was published in the U.S., and it sold 70,000 copies.




